

# SAGINAW-BAY CITY MEET SATURDAY

FIRST OUTDOOR MEET OF THE  
YEAR TO BE HELD AT BAY  
CITY SATURDAY.

Many Enthusiasts Expected to accom-  
pany the Team From Here—Re-  
sult Depends Greatly on  
New Men.

A track meet with Bay City, at the down-river town, and a baseball game between the High school and the Rainier team, is the program for the high school athletics Saturday. This is the first appearance of the high school track team for the season and they are up against one of the stiffest propositions of the year, their old friend the enemy—Bay City. The meet should be one of the best that has ever been held in the bay town, as both teams are so evenly balanced. Bay City has lost but a few of their last year men, while Saginaw is about in the same boat, and the raw material should prove the question of the day. Whether Saginaw's new men or Bay City's recruits will be the best point winners for their side will be the deciding factor of the meet.

By the dope sheet it looks as though the Saginaw aggregation has the best of the argument. It is known, however that the Bay City boys have had abundance of time for outdoor practice on their own track, and the Saginaw boys, owing primarily to their own inclinations and secondly to the natural conditions of the weather, have not had a chance to get hardly any outside work whatsoever, which is sure to provide a strong drawback to their winning. There are also a few of the main point gainers who will not compete; McVety or Birss, it is thought, will not go into the runs. Of the latter, it is not quite certain; but McVety will not compete, it is certain. Following are both Bay City and Saginaw entries, with their first two men. Last year the Bay Cityites won by a narrow margin, less than an inch in fact, but they are severely handicapped by the loss of Finkensteedt. However, they figure that their points in this race already settled.

The Saginaw boys will leave at noon, and it is expected that a large delegation will move along with them.

The baseball game is not yet certain, but if pulled off will be held at Recreation park near 4 o'clock.
