

HIGH SCHOOL BOYS TO USE NORMAL "GYM."

PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED TO TRACK TEAM—CROSS-COUNTRY RUN.

Principal Gould and Mr. Holden of the high school have made arrangements with the Normal faculty for the use of the Normal gym for the high school track team. Candidates for the team will begin practice under the supervision of Mr. Holden week after next. Mr. Holden, who is instructor in chemistry, has had more or less experience with track teams since entering the school, and was formerly a star on the college team. It will be necessary to limit the number of candidates because of the Normal students.

The outlook for the team has been made somewhat brighter by Principal Gould's promise of a new vaulting pole, and Mr. Waite, manual training, has donated his services by making the enthusiasts some new jumping standards. Gilman Lane, a Senior, has offered to furnish the boys with shot and hammers.

Cross-Country Run.

A cross-country run will take place about the first of March between high school, Normal and college. Points will be scored on the average time in which the distance is made. The regular annual interclass meet will be held the latter part of April.

The first of May is the date set for the field meet between the three local schools.

May 22 Marshall, Battle Creek and Kalamazoo will clash for honors at the first named city, and probably a meet will be arranged with Grand Rapids on the Woodard avenue grounds. A captain has not been chosen as yet, but Baker looks like the man for the job.
