

SELECTS TEAM FOR SATURDAY

Coach Collins Names Track Men For Central's Dual With Ann Arbor High Team.

PROSPECTS ARE BRIGHT FOR A STRONG TEAM

D. U. S. Track Boys to Meet the Toledo Central Athletes. Here March 27.

Central's high school track team is fast rounding into shape preparatory to its coming dual meet with the Ann Arbor high school, Saturday evening in the Central gym. Every afternoon, under the direction of Coach Jack Collins and Capt. "Bud" Widman, the boys are working like niggers and the hard work is showing results.

At the same time the pruning knife is working over time and now the squad is cut down to about where it will be for the rest of the season. At the start of the workouts a large bunch of aspirants for the team were out, but as fast as they showed that they wouldn't come up to requirements they were relegated to the rear and the attention was given to the more promising ones in the squad.

As it stands now it looks as though the boys that will beat the colors of Central this year at the track and ball are those that Collins has named for the meet with the University town boys.

How They Will Start the Season

Collins is satisfied that has the material for a winning team and is just as confident of beating Ann Arbor next Saturday night. In the meantime efforts will be made to hold a couple of more dates with some of the better known schools.

As Collins is driving the boys of the track team so is Coach "Coffee" Larson with the basketball squad. Larson never lets a day slip but what he gets the boys into the gym for a stiff practice. "Coffee" is pointing the boys for what they consider the biggest game of the year, the deciding game for the state high school championship with Eastern, which comes up for settlement some time next week. This week they play Muskegon, Friday afternoon. Muskegon has been beaten by the Southwest City aggregation, who in turn were soundly trounced by Central. Central should win this one case up.

A week from Saturday, March 27, the D. U. S. track team will take on the strong Central high team, of Toledo. Coach Knickerbocker realizes that this will be a more severe test on his men than the M. A. C. freshmen and will have them in better shape. Ten events, including a relay race will constitute the program, which will start at 2:30 o'clock.
