

**ANCIENT RIVALS  
MEET SATURDAY**

**Central and D. U. S. Athletes  
Will Clash in Big Games  
at M. A. C.**

Though it has not been generally known, the track squad of the Detroit University squad will compete in the fourth annual interscholastic track meet under the auspices of the Michigan Agricultural college Saturday afternoon. The Elmwood avenue lads received an invitation along with the rest of the Michigan preparatory schools and will send the strongest team that they will be able to collect from their ranks.

For the past two weeks, D. U. S. has silently been at work in preparation for this same meet, but withheld the information from the other local schools, for fear of driving some of the weaker teams away. That much was learned in a conversation with the track coaches at the Elmwood avenue school early last week.

The fact that D. U. S. will attend the meet ought to bring joy to the followers of Central High school and Detroit university. For several years the Blue and White has evaded the issue with the Red and Blue, not because the athletes at the Cass avenue school were in mortal fear of the other institution, but because the faculty of the north end would permit no such meeting.

**No Chance for Dual.**

As long as Central continues its present attitude toward D. U. S. there will be no chance to compare the strength of the schools in the various sports in a dual meet and the chance that the schools will have Saturday to meet in conflict should be welcomed by the student bodies of both institutions.

About the only athlete at the Blue and Red school not eligible to compete at the Lansing meet in Seymour, who is over the age limit. With the loss of but one man, and with a fairly good runner to take his place in the quarter, Coach Knickerbocker's boys will form the team that the winners will have to beat out.
