

CENTRAL HIGH IS FORMIDABLE

Detroit Boys Score Well in the Field Events at Michigan Interscholastic.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 21.—By virtue of firsts in the shot put, hammer throw and discus, Kohler, of Lansing high, put his team in the lead at the end of the first day's events in the twelfth annual Michigan interscholastic meet. Muskegon was second with 145-6 points, 1-2 of a point behind Lansing. Ann Arbor high was third with 35-6 points and Detroit Central fourth with 31-6.

In the hammer throw, Kohler broke the Michigan interscholastic record with a heave of 170 feet 3 inches. Except for the performances of Kohler in the weight events and the work of Shaw, of Muskegon, in the pole vaults, the field events were devoid of features. Shaw attempted to break the interscholastic record of 11 feet 3 inches, but failed. Hyde Park and St. Cyril academy, both of Chicago, the only two outside teams competing in the weight events, finished in seventh and ninth places respectively at the end of the first day.

The finals in all of the track events will be run off Saturday. Detroit Central, Hyde Park and Muskegon seem to have an equal show for the highest number of points in these.

Widman Should Be Winner.

From the results of the preliminary heats in the dashes, Widman, of Detroit Central, should have an easy time of it in both the 100 and 220. Forbes, of Hyde Park, and Lytle, of Shelby, will probably have a good fight for second and third places. Craig, of Central, won his heats in both the hurdles, but Schaefer, of Muskegon, and Llewellyn, of Hyde Park, will push him for first honors in the finals.

Twelve-pound shot-put—Kohler (Lansing), first; Quinn (Saginaw), second; Reule (Ann Arbor), third; Roper (Ann Arbor), fourth. Distance, 45 feet, 1 inch.

Discus-throw—Kohler (Lansing), first; Hendrix (Muskegon), second; Hewitt (Hyde Park), third; Llewellyn (Hyde Park), fourth. Distance, 106 feet, 3 inches.

Twelve-pound hammer—Kohler (Lansing), first; Beech (Muskegon), second; Yonker (Toledo), third; Rider (Shelby), fourth. Distance, 170 feet, 2 inches.

High jump—Sargent (Shelby), Weber (Toledo) and Van Huse (Detroit Central), tied for first. What (Ann Arbor), Montgomery (Central) and Schaefer (Muskegon), tied for fourth. Height, 5 feet, 2 inches.

Broad jump—Johnson (Ann Arbor), first; Schaefer (Muskegon), second; Slobert (Detroit), third; Llewellyn (Hyde Park), fourth. Distance, 20 feet, 1½ inches.
