

**LOCALS WON TRACK MEET FROM MEMPHIS**

Score stood 54 to 50 at Close of Events.

Relay Race Won by Locals, Most Exciting Event.

Bump! The biggest athletic event of the season was started at the Athletic field yesterday, when the local high school track team captured the meet from the Memphis bunch. From the time the affair started until the last event was run off every person on the ground was in suspense, fearing that the visitors would carry off the honors of the day, but fate was against them, and when the last event was finished the locals had four points to the good.

One of the most exciting races was the only race. It was necessary for the home bunch to win this or the day was lost, and when the local men came out to start the cheering of the crowd was deafening. Lester Smith started the race and when he finished his distance he gave Clark a lead of about forty feet. Weston was the next Port Huron man in line and was followed by Pead who finished first leaving his opponent at a distance. Coach Walter Small, of the local track squad, deserves a great amount of credit for the manner in which he has handled the men and for the interest he has taken in high school athletics, both in football and track work. 110 yard low hurdles—Hause, Memphis, first; Jenks, Port Huron, second; Ernst, Port Huron, third; time, 15 4-8 seconds.

100 yard dash—Weston, Port Huron, first; Clark, Port Huron, second; Coburn, Memphis, third; time, 10 1-2 seconds.

Shot put—Brown, Memphis, first; Sawyer, Port Huron, second; Crawford, Port Huron, third; distance, 32 feet nine inches.

220 yard dash—Pead, Port Huron, first; Sweeney, Memphis, second; Weston, Port Huron, third; time, 25 4-8 seconds.

Pole vault—Jarvis, Memphis, first; Saunders, Port Huron, and Hause, Memphis, tied for second place; height vaulted, 9 feet 3 inches.

440 yard dash—Sweeney, Memphis, first; Coburn, Memphis, second; Springer, Port Huron, third; time, 59 seconds.

High jump—Hause, Memphis, first; Pead, Port Huron, second; Jarvis, Memphis, third; height jumped, 5 feet 2 inches.

Running broad jump—Sweeney, Memphis, first; Pead, Port Huron, second; Saunders, Port Huron, third; distance jumped, 18 feet 10 inches.

1/2 mile run—Seaver, Port Huron, first; Hause, Memphis, second; Springer, Port Huron, third; time, 2:16 4-5 seconds.

Standing broad jump—Brown, Memphis, first; Pead, Port Huron, second; Coburn, Memphis, third; distance jumped, 9 feet 5 1/2 inches.

1 mile run—Hill, Port Huron, first; Seaver, Port Huron, second; Hause, Memphis, third; time, 8:40 4-5 seconds.

Relay race—Port Huron, first; Smith, Pead, G. Clark and Weston ran for Port Huron.
