

## LOCALS WON THE TRACK MEET FRIDAY

Defeated Detroit Eastern Team by Four Points.  
Jenks, Clark and Seaver Score Most Points.

Friday afternoon at the Athletic field the local high school track team defeated the team from the Eastern high school of Detroit, by the close score of 47 to 43. The meet started at 3:00 o'clock with the 100 yard hurdles as the first event. Carlton Jenks broke the tape and was followed by "Wirey" Ernst. Among the men who won most points for the locals were Jenks, Glen Clark and Seaver. From the time the meet started until the last event was pulled off there was not a person on the grounds who was sure as to which side the decision would be awarded. More depended on the last event, than any other, the running broad jump. When the men were called for the jump the score stood 42 to 28 in Port Huron's favor and it was up to them to get first or second and third place or lose out, but the local boys rallied when they saw it was their final chance and when the results were given, Detroit had first place while Peck and Saunders took second, winning the day for Port Huron.

The events as they were pulled off and the winners were:

One hundred and ten yard low hurdles—Jenks, first; Ernst, second; Snow, third; time 16 2/5 seconds.

One hundred dash—Drew, first; Weston, second; E. Clark, third; time 10 2/5 seconds.

High jump—Snow, first; Black, second; Fead, third; height jumped 4 ft. 11 inches.

Twelve pound shot put—Black, first; Crawford, second; Drew, third; distance 32 feet 11 inches.

Four hundred and forty yard run—G. Clark, first; Rockham, second; L. Smith, third; time 61 1/5 seconds.

One mile run—Seaver, first; Arin, second; Hill, third; time 5 hours 28 2/5 seconds.

Pole vault—Saunders, first; Weauska, second; Armstrong, third; height 8 feet 4 inches.

One-half mile run—Seaver, first; Drew, second; Springer, third; time 2 minutes 28 1/5 seconds.

Two hundred and twenty yard dash—Drew, first; Fead, second; Weston, third; time 26 seconds.

Broad jump—Black, first; Fead, second; Saunders, third; distance 18 feet.

The timers were Whitney Parsons, John Lassen and Charles Boyce.  
Judges—Russel Jackson, McKenzie, and Harold Vance. Starter—Harold Davis. Scorer, J. J. Schmitt. Attendance, 500.
