

MEET IS EASY FOR CENTRAITES

Local Boys Outclass the Ann Arbor High Team in Dual Encounter.

Showing themselves to be strong where they were thought to be weak, the squirts and displaying improved form in the track events that they were considered to be fairly well fortified, Central high school track athletes handed the representatives of Ann Arbor high school a sound beating, to say the least, to about 400 squirts who watched the boys wallow in the mud at the Detroit Athletic club field yesterday afternoon.

Last time the squirts met it was indoors. Then Central won from the up-state lads by 123 points. Ann Arbor wasn't satisfied with the result and believed that in a meeting out-of-doors it could trim the boys of Central. Yesterday that belief was effectively manifested from their minds. When the last event on the program, the pole vault, had been finished, Central showed a total of 61-2 for its share to 9 for the invaders from the university town.

Of the 12 events that were contested Central romped away with seven, tied with Ann Arbor for great place in two, and took second in one and third in two others in which first honors went to the opposition.

The track was far from ideal for a track meet, the recent rains having left the field in a muddy condition, causing considerable trouble to the boys, especially those contesting in the broad jump, high jump and pole vault. Real good work was next to impossible in the latter events, and though Van Huesen upheld the honors of his school in each, he failed to displace anywhere near his usual good form for that reason.

Kennedy's Run a Feature.

Kennedy's run in the quarter-mile for Central was easily the feature of the day. The little fellow, after trailing a bunch of five to within ten yards of the tape, suddenly dashed out of the heap with a splendid spurt, and grabbed the event in the fast time of 27.2-4.

As was fitting for such a grand event, Central's Ari Widman led his team in scoring with a total of 22 points, five in the 100 yards dash, a like number in the 250 and three points in the broad jump. The summaries:

100 yards dash—Widman, Central, first; Mills, Ann Arbor, second; Johnson, Ann Arbor, third. Time, 22.2.

Half mile—Parks, Central, first; Kennedy, Central, second; Henderson, Ann Arbor, third. Time, 2:15.

1 mile—Widman, Central, second; Sobert, Central, first. Distance 10 ft. 2 in.

1 1/2 mile run—Henderson, Central, first; Mills, Ann Arbor, second; Montgomery, Central, third. Time, 12:30.

Two-mile run—Hull, Ann Arbor, first; 27.2-4; Johnson, Ann Arbor, second; 27.2-4; in. 19:00; Central, third; 24:1-4 in.

Quarter mile—Kennedy, Central, first; Hanson, Ann Arbor, second; Maloney, Central, third. Time, 2:22.

Half mile—Montgomery, Central, first; Hanson, Ann Arbor, tied for first at 5 ft.; Van Huesen, Central, and Ober, Ann Arbor, tied for third at 4 ft. 5 in. Points were divided in this race, 65 points to each team.

1 1/2 mile run—Widman, Central, first; 27.2-4; Johnson, Ann Arbor, second; 27.2-4; in. 19:00; Central, third; 24:1-4 in.

Second best—Van Huesen, Central, first; Hanson, Ann Arbor, second; Time, 5:30.

100 yards high hurdle—Hull, Ann Arbor, first; Central, second; Van Huesen, Central, tied for first; Central, third. Time, 1:15.

120 yards high hurdle—Hull, Ann Arbor, first; Central, second; Van Huesen, Central, tied for first; Central, third. Time, 1:15.

Twenty-pound hammer throw—Hanson, Central, first; Schiller, Central, second; Hull, Ann Arbor, third. Distance 96 ft. 5 in.

Pole vault—Van Huesen, Central, and Montgomery, Central, tied for first at 8 ft. 4 in.; Sobert, Central, and Wilbur, Ann Arbor, tied for third at 8 ft.
