

D. U. S. ATHLETES IN SIXTH PLACE

**Aside From Spiegel's Victory in
40-Yard Dash, Detroiters
Perform Indifferently.**

Chicago, February 22.—In one of the most interesting indoor track meets ever held here, Hyde Park high school, of Chicago, this afternoon took the first honors in the Princeton University alumni interscholastic games from contenders representing 22 high schools and academies. The Detroit University school athletes, who were favorites yesterday, failed to come up to the expectations of their admirers and finished in sixth place, with a total of six points. Oak Park high school took second honors with a total of sixteen points and the Harvard school was third with ten. The winners scored a total of 22 points.

Spiegel was the bright and shining light for the Detroit school, scoring five of his team's points by virtue of his victory in the forty-yard dash. Tuomy showed a flash of speed in this event when he crossed the line second in the second heat.

Charles Barton annexed the sixth and last point for the Detroit school when he cleared 10 feet 4 inches in the pole vault and was awarded third place. The winner cleared the bar at 10 feet 6 inches.

Spiegel's time in the 40-yard dash was 2 seconds flat.
