

BIG SCHOLASTIC MEET AT M. A. C.

Schools From All Over the State Will Send Representative Track Men.

SECOND PLACE WINNERS LAST SEASON

Plans Are Made to Entertain the Young Athletes at East Lansing.

East Lansing, Mich., April 21.—The annual M. A. C. interscholastic track and field meet will be held on the athletic field at East Lansing, Mich., May 14. Never before has so large a number of contestants come from so wide a geographical area. In 1909, the meet was more than 100 miles from the central part of the state. This year, the indication is that this year's meet will be attended by schools from every remote part of the state. Last year, thirty-five high schools were represented and over 300 athletes participated. It is indicated that this year's meet will be considerably larger than the year's big meet. Extensive plans are being made to entertain the young athletes. They are the guests of the M. A. C. There are two variations of the Syracuse playing here on Monday afternoon May 13, and Kalamazoo facing Coach Brewster on Tuesday forenoon. There will be a drawing exhibit under the auspices of the M. A. C. department of drawing and design, in which public school work in drawing from all parts of the state will be exhibited. There will also be a promenade band concert in the college armory Friday evening. The visitors will be furnished with free entertainment, lodging, etc., and every effort will be made on the part of the student body to make the high school lads believe that life is worth living at M. A. C. The meet will be open to all high schools in the state and also preparatory schools, among which is D. U. S. of Detroit, which won second place in the meet last year. The Michigan Interscholastic athletic rules as adopted by the Michigan Schoolmasters' club will control the eligibility of the contestants. A huge banner will be awarded to the team winning the largest number of points, and gold, silver and bronze medals to individual athletes taking first, second and third place respectively, in each event. A ribbon will be given to the winner of the fourth place in each event, and a fine souvenir job will be tendered every contestant in the meet.

Four Entries in Each Event.

Each school may enter four athletes in each event, but only two may start. The entries close May 9. Following is the list of events which will be pulled off and the order in which they are scheduled to take place: 100 yard dash, 120 yard high hurdle, one mile run, 440 yard dash, 220 yard dash, one-half mile run, 220 yard low hurdles, two mile run, one-half mile relay (Class A), one-half mile relay (Class B). The field events will be held at the same time and in the following order: Running high jump, putting 12-pound shot, running broad jump, discus throw, pole vault and throwing 12-pound hammer. The Class B relay is restricted to the smaller schools, and teams from the following larger high schools will be required to compete in the Class A relay: Ann Arbor, Battle Creek, Bay City (East and West), Calumet, Detroit (Central, Western and Eastern), D. U. S., Grand Rapids (Central), Jackson, Lansing, Kalamazoo, Muskegon and Saginaw (East and West). The events will be held on the college athletic field, on which there is a fine quarter mile cinder track. All of the events, including the preliminaries, will be held on the afternoon of May 14.
