

MUSKEGON AND SHELBY STRONG

**Look Like Most Formidable Con-
tenders in Ann Arbor
Track Meet.**

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 20.—Michi-
gan's thirteenth annual interschol-
astic track meet began this after-
noon under friendly weather condi-
tions and with about 125 prep
school athletes in attendance.

Today's program included finals
in all field events except broad
jump and trial heats in 100 and
200-yard dashes, quarter-mile and
half hurdles. Only inaccurate pre-
diction as to the outcome of the
meet can be gained from this after-
noon's performances, but already
the fight has narrowed to a con-
test between Muskegon, last year's
winner, and Shelby's well-balanced
team.

Lansing is leading tonight in total
number of points scored, but the
lads from the state capital are
thorough and will quit the meet with
only the 16 1-2 points they now have
to their credit.
