

EASTERN SQUAD IS VICTORIOUS

Finds Ann Arbor Track Team Easy Prey in Schools' Initial Dual.

CAPTAIN ARMSTRONG IS STAR OF THE MEET

Detroit Boy Scores Three Firsts, One Second and One Third

—Score is 93 to 36.

Ann Arbor, April 21.—Within its own halliwick and congenial surroundings, Ann Arbor High school felt an easy prey to Detroit Eastern here tonight. The athletes who hold forth in the eastern portion of Michigan, metropolis, outclassed the which Eastern looked upon as Ann Arbor's credit with a remarkable degree of ease.

Eastern's superiority is fairly well balanced, showing confidence, strength, where Eastern was thought to be weakest. Particularly in the distance and distance events, Eastern failed to lose. One of the University Zephyr squad leading back, however, Detroit added to its tally in later events. When William and won second place by a healthy margin over Church and Edwards, who struggled the entire distance track and took for the show position.

Ann Arbor Beat in Jumps.

Ann Arbor showed stronger in the events and jumps, but the Zephyr men did their work so well in the earlier events that, and Ann Arbor boys took to the jumping stage seemed to exert a more complete discipline. The men from the college took showed to the front in the high jump and standing broad jump. In the last event a Detroit took the place, while in the later event on Eastern led except for this place, thereby enabling the visitors to score four points where Ann Arbor similarly was three.

The feature performance from a Detroit standpoint was the work of Armstrong. The Eastern captain seems here to be one second and one third in a total of 15 points. Together with a number of seconds and three thirds among the rest—Ann Arbor far out in the first—er in fact, the yellow and black team was in danger.

Splendid Throw by Edwards.

For a practically unheard of performance for Edwards' throw of 47.7, 2 1/4 inches in the shot put treated considerable comment. With Eastern out of the thermodynamic scale now, the Ann Arbor boy is looked to have this event at the mercy. If he only can continue in his present form, the rest of the competitors are far out. It is not that Edwards was not one of the others after his initial put, however, Eastern again broke into the going, when Edwards threw out Edwards for second.
