

## JEFFERSON BOYS EMERGE WINNERS

### Have Good Margin in Winning Grammar School Meet From Others.

After an all-day session in the grammar school track meet at the Central high gym, the Jefferson school finally won the trophy with a total of 23 points. The nearest competitor, the Fairbanks school, accumulated 18 points or just half as many as the winners.

Of the 53 schools that entered the meet, 24 were able to take points, ranging from 33 down to a single one. The elimination events commenced at 9:30 a. m. and continued until late in the afternoon, the finals being run off in the evening.

There were three classes in most of events, the 6th, 7th and 8th grades of the different schools. The best results were obtained in the 8th grade class by virtue of its having the older boys. Three of the events, the low hurdles, pole vault and the 440-yard dash were only open to the 8th graders, but all classes entered the 50-yard dash, broad and high jumps, 220-yard dash and the 12-pound shot put.

The best performance of the evening was made by Mead of the Jefferson school in the shot put when he heaved the lead 27 feet 11 inches. This is exceptional for a lad in the 8th grade, the same distance having made points in many scholastic dual meets.

A standing broad jump of 7 feet 9 1/4 inches was made by Johnson of the Farnand school, which is very good for a grammar school lad. Lane of the Estabrook and Sullivan of the Fairbanks tied in the high jump at 5 feet 3 inches, the former winning on the toss up.

No time was taken in the track events, but all the races were close and very exciting, the 440 being the feature dash.
