

LANSING HOPES TO AVENGE DEFEAT

**LOCAL ATHLETES MEET BATTLE
CREEK ON TRACK NEXT
THURSDAY.**

**Harvey and Baske Expected to Be
Point Winners for Lansing While
Cook is Shining Light of Visitors.**

Lansing high school track men will attempt to avenge the defeat administered by the Battle Creek team last winter when the teams clash on College field Thursday, May 23. The local lads claim they were handicapped by a strange floor and track last winter and that they are confident of coping the meet next Thursday.

Two men on whom Lansing places much reliance to win are Bayard Harvey and Clarence Baske, point winners at the Adrian Interscholastic. Harvey captured third place in the pole vault and the broad jump events and tied for third in the 100 yard dash. Baske was second in the half mile. In the recent inter-class meet, Harvey was the individual point winner with a total of 28 1-2 points.

The only athlete of the visiting aggregation feared by Lansing is Cook, a colored boy, who shines in the mile. Cook is the fastest miler in the state this season, doing the stunt in 4:25, remarkably good time for school boys. Next Thursday Cook is entered in both mile and half-mile and will be opposed by Capt. Wellman of Lansing in the longer distance while Baske will attempt to take the half-mile.

In case the boys realize enough funds from the Battle Creek meet, they are planning to send a team to the Michigan Interscholastic gathering to be held June 8 at Bois Blanc. The public should donate generously to the cause.

The baseball team is playing this afternoon at Athens.

The events in the track meet next Thursday follow: 100 yard dash, 220 yard dash, 40 yard dash, mile run, 120 yard hurdles, half mile, pole vault, high jump, shot put, hammer throw, discus throw, broad jump and relay run.
