Houghton Scores 57 points. Hancock Second With 32,
The Houghton high school track team took first place and Hancock second place at the track and field meet of the upper peninsula schools, the locals making 57 points, Hancock 28 and Marquette third with 22. Pelto of Hancock made a new record for hammer throwing, 115 feet, 4 inches and McGlynn also of Hancock estab- lished a new record for the pole valit with a mark of ten feet. Larsen of Hancock won the half mile and Earett the 440 yard run, in which Bawden of Houghton was a close second. Cochrane of Houghton equalled the best mark for the dieus throw, making
91 feet six inches. Worthing won the 50 yard dash in 5 4-5 seconds, Cross of Houghton coming second. Worthing took the 100 yard dash in 10 3-5 sec- onds, Cross of Houghton being third in this event.
Preiffer, the youngest boy at the meet, surprises all by making a mark of five minutes, five seconds for the
mile event, which comes near equaling the best interscholastic mark for this event. Bawden won the run- ning broad jump, with 17 feet 8 inches and Houghton won the mile and half
mile relays, Worthing, Pfeiffer Pen- berthy and Rogers representing the school in the mile event and Cross, Penberthy, Rogers and Worthing in
the half mile relay. Cross of Hough- ton took the 220 yard dash, making it in 24 1-5 seconds.
Twelve schools participated in the events at the track meet Saturday and considering the heavy track, due to a light drizzling rain, the marks
made are considered exceptionally good.
