

# Senior Class Winner At Indoor Track Meet

Lansing High School Athletes in Big Event at Y. M. C. A. Saturday Night--To Be Annual Affair--L. H. S. Meets Battle Creek Next Saturday.

The first indoor track meet ever held by Lansing high school took place at the Y. M. C. A. gymnasium Saturday night and so satisfactory did it prove that it will hereafter be an annual event. The event was held as an interclass meet, and also as a try-out for positions on the track team which will compete with Battle Creek high school at Battle Creek next Saturday.

**Seniors Win First Place.**  
With points totaling 51 5-8, the senior class won the meet and the beautiful banner which goes with it. The banner will be placed in the Auditorium of the high school. The juniors were second, the freshmen third and the sophomores fourth.

Keen rivalry from the very start marked the meeting, and so hard did the athletes work that some very creditable marks were made, especially in the running events.

Halstead of the senior class was the biggest individual point winner of the meet, scoring 24 points for his class. A number of the other boys piled up clusters of points.

**Freshmen Make Good Showing.**  
One of the features of the meet was the showing of the freshman class. Although the youngsters had been working hard in preparation for the big event, none of the other classes would concede them better than fourth place, but the freshies surprised them by finishing one notch higher than the sophomores.

Athletic Director E. J. Shassburger of the high school faculty, was highly pleased with the result of the meet, and is sure that with the material developed, Lansing high will have an indoor track team to be proud of. The dual meet with Battle Creek high next Saturday will be a hard test for the squad, and if they win, it will be something to rejoice over.

**Much Interest is Shown.**  
Interest in indoor athletics increases every day at the school, and the crowd which attended the events at the gymnasium Saturday night was large and enthusiastic. Each class had a colony of rooters backing them and the gym presented a lively scene for some time.
