

## LANSING HIGH WINS INDOOR TRACK MEET

**GREAT TRIUMPH AT BATTLE  
CREEK SATURDAY, IN WHICH  
LANSING ATHLETES PROVE  
THEIR METAL.**

**SCORE 68 1-2 TO 35 1-2**

**Halstead Stars for Lansing, Scoring  
20 Points, Winning Every Jump  
Event—Good Marks Feature  
Dashes and Jumps.**

Scoring 68 1-2 points to 35 1-2 points for Battle Creek, Lansing high school's indoor track team spring a big surprise at Battle Creek Saturday. Although the team of the local school had hoped to make a good showing, the fact that they would win had not been admitted, and in Battle Creek before the meet started it was said there was no chance for Lansing.

**Hang Up Good Marks.**

But by getting a score almost double that of their opponents and on their opponents' own floor indicates some fighting spirit. Some very good marks were made by the contestants, and the Lansing boys figured strongly in all of them.

Halstead was the individual star of the meet, scoring 20 points for the Lansing team. He won all of the jumping events. Hodson, a freshman of the Lansing high school, came within an inch of the state record for the high dive and other marks by the boys were correspondingly good.

**Battle Creek Track Fast.**

The track in the gym at Battle Creek is lightning fast when the contestants get used to it. It is banked high at the turns, and with a little practice the boys can slip around it in fast time. All of the running events good time was made.

For Battle Creek Webber made the best showing, getting 11 3-4 points.

Athletic Director Shansberger of the local school is greatly pleased with the showing of the team, and has words of praise for every member of the squad.

Half-mile run—Sprang, first; Hoague, second; Melhan, third. Time—2:39 2-5.

220-yard dash—Gore, first; Webber, second; Beau, third. Time—26 3-5 seconds.

Pole vault—Murphy, first; Bailey, second; Friends, third. Height—8 feet, 8 inches.

High dive—Pinch, first; Hodson, second; Webber, third. Height—5 feet, 8 inches.

Standing broad jump—Halstead, first; Hodson, second; Sullivan, third. Distance—3 feet, 4 1-2 inches.

140-yard dash—Webber, first; Healey, second; Beau, third. Time—1:01.

Running high jump—Halstead, first; Bailey-Lapham, second; Sulli-

van-Keith, third. Height—5 feet, 2 inches.

Mile run—Roscoe, first; Stebbins, second; Friends, third. Time—2:20.

Running broad jump—Halstead, first; Sprang, second; Healey, third. Distance—18 feet, 2 1-2 inches.

Standing high jump—Halstead, first; Sullivan, second; Bailey-Webber, third. Height—4 feet, 6 inches.

Relay-race—Battle Creek, (Pinch, Webber, Friends, Beau), first; Lansing (Hodson, Sprang, Bailey, Healey), second.

Total points: Lansing high school, 68 1-2; Battle Creek high school, 35 1-2. Lansing's points were scored as follows: Halstead, 20; Healey, 9; Sprang, 8; Hodson, 6; Sullivan, 5; Roscoe, 5; Murphy, 5; Bailey, 4 1-2; Hoague, 2; Stebbins, 2.
