CLOSE CONTEST IN TRACK MEETING

Luck broke against Saginaw high Saturday in the track meet with Bay City Eastern, the locals finishing at the short end of the score of 63 to 59, and performing without two of its leaders, Capt. Davis and Robertson, both reliable point getters. O'Donnell, of Saginaw, was having things his own way in the low hurdles, when he stumped at the last barrier, causing a loss of 8 points, or more than enough to have won the meet. Seeley, for Saginaw, broke two school records, doing the mile in 4:58 and the half in 2:09 4-5. Smith and Perkins were the point takers for Bay City, the former getting 25 and the latter 21.
