Foss, of University High, Chicago, Shatters Mark for State Interscholastic and Perry Field.

Ann Arbor, Mich., May 23.—There was little in the big University of Michigan interscholastic meet at Ann Arbor Friday afternoon which would cause the heart of a Detroit-er to swell with pride.

Of the 13 men sent out by two Detroit schools, only one placed in the events which were completed Friday afternoon, and but three of them were able to survive the acid test of the preliminary heats.

When the last field event had been run off Friday afternoon Grand Rapids was found to be in the lead with 14 points, with Lewis Institute of Chicago trailing with 11. University high, also of the Windy City, was next with seven. Joe Horner's interscholastic pole-vault record of 11 feet 2 inches was broken by Foss of the University high of Chicago, when he floated over the bar with slightly over 12 feet of ether between him and Mother Earth. The exact measurement showed that he had vaulted 12 feet and 9-16 of an inch. Every precaution was taken to have the measurement correct, and it will be taken as official.

Foss's performance not only establishes a new interscholastic mark, but also sets a fresh one for Perry field.

**Record Was 11 Feet 2 Inches.**  
The record for the big athletic field was 11 feet 8 inches and Foss had some of the best pole-vaulters in the university watching him with eager interest. The Chicago ind

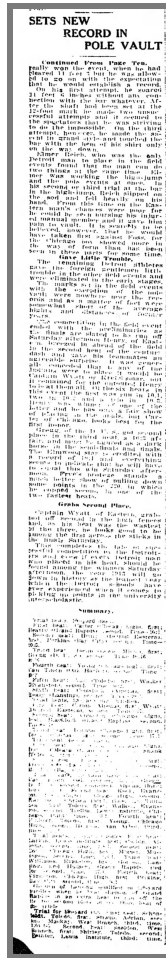
