

St. Joseph Freshmen Make Great Showing

St. Joseph did not do so worse up at South Haven, Saturday, when a preliminary track meet was held by the South Haven, Kalamazoo and St. Joseph high schools, and considering that in the field events four out of five first places were taken by St. Joseph freshmen, the prospects for next year are already casting a brilliant light over the athletic horizon.

Herring took the first place in the pole vault, vaulting 9 feet 6 inches, and in the standing broad jump took first place, making 9 feet 2 inches. Schultz, the freshman basket ball center, made good in the running broad jump with a record of 18 feet and 9 inches, and in the high jump backed up Coach Whitehead's prediction with a jump of 5 feet 2 inches. He also took second place in the

standing broad jump, Herring leading him by only a small margin. Herring, let it be known, is the only upper class man who made first place, the youngsters who Coach Whitehead has been working into shape far outclassing the older students.

In the track events St. Joseph took only one first, and that was made by Leonard Merchant, who proved to be the "dark horse" of the meet. Merchant made the 220 yard dash in 24 seconds. He also took third in the 100 yard event. Dykstra made third in the 880 yard run.

The relay team came to grief when Rex Wynkoop stumbled and fell and on that one misfortune the local school lost the meet. Wynkoop was easily ten feet ahead of his man when his shoe caught and down went St. Joseph with a dull, sickening thud.
