

Lansing High, With Well Balanced Track Team, Wins Meet at St. Johns Saturday

ST. JOHNS, June 2.—Lansing high school won first place with a total of 32 points in the tenth annual track and field meet held at the Fair grounds Saturday afternoon. East Lansing won second, a total of 24 points, with a three-man team. St. Johns was third, 19 points.

The meet was the largest ever held here, nine schools competing with 75 athletes entered. Every event was closely contested and at different times four schools each had a chance to win the championship banner which was finally awarded to Lansing. The other schools entered and the number of points won were as follows: Fenton 14, Ionia 10, Ovid 5, Grand Ledge 2, Maple Rapids 1, and Durand 1.

David Peppard of East Lansing was awarded the silver cup for individual championship, he having won 18 points, being first the 220 yard dash, the shot put and broad jump and second in the 100-yard dash.

Garlock of St. Johns ran a remarkable race in the one-half mile, taking a big lead in the first and keeping it up throughout.

Although the track was in poor condition, Gordon of Fenton, won the 440-yard dash in 55 seconds, with Garlock of St. Johns a close second.

Lansing's team was not spectacular, having no big stars, but was well balanced and won three firsts, five seconds and two thirds.
