

First Annual "Relay Carnival,"
Under Auspices of Lansing H. S. A. A.
Next Saturday, Brings Entries From
Cities Throughout Southern Michigan

Grand Rapids, Ann Arbor, Jackson, Battle Creek, Alpena, Adrian, Ionia, Charlotte, Mason, St. Louis and many other smaller cities in this part of the state have sent word that they will enter teams in the big "relay carnival" to be held at the old race track grounds next Saturday afternoon under the auspices of the Lansing high school athletic association. This assures a large and successful meet, a fine start for the "carnival" is to be an annual affair hereafter.

Winners Get Beautiful Cups.
 Through the kindness of several local merchants, J. H. Larrabee, L. D. Whitney and James O'Connor, who have donated cups to the athletic association, a cup will go to the winner of each relay race. There will be three races, the half-mile, mile and two-mile.

These cups are to be contested for annually, and the school which wins one three times may retain it permanently.

Local Runners Are Busy.
 A slight change was made in the plans of Athletic Director Shassberger of L. H. S. today. He tries out his half-mile runners for the two-mile relay team, and the 220-yard dash men for the half-mile relay team. Tomorrow night he will test the abilities of the quarter-milers so as to pick a mile relay team.

The prospect of the Lansing school in at least one of the races is indeed very bright. This is the half-mile, for with the team that defeated Battle Creek last week exceptionally good time has been clipped off. Harvey, Prine, Sprang and Healey stepped the half-mile in the remarkably good time of one minute and 39 seconds. The coach helps to get better results out of the team than this.

Officials Selected.
 C. J. Oviatt, holder of several M. A. C. records, and one of the coaches of the M. A. C. track team at present, a man thoroughly acquainted with all track athletics, will act as starter. J. H. Larrabee and P. J. Shassberger will be timekeepers.

With the interest that has been shown throughout this part of the state, and even from Alpena, a city nearly 300 miles from here, a successful meet is a certainty. Good weather is all that is needed.
