

First Field and Track Meet of Grammar Schools of City Proves to be Great Success

The big field and track meet which was held by the Grammar schools of this city, Friday afternoon, at the Athletic park was pulled off without a break. The features of the meet were the running of Curry of the Washington school and Robert Houston, high jumper, of the Fillmore school. Houston is only 4 feet 5 inches in height and was the smallest boy who competed and although he did not win this event his clearing the bar at 4 feet two, nearly his natural height, brought cheers from the large crowd which attended the meet. The Washington team easily copped the meet with the Fillmore second. The large blanket which was given to the winners of the relay was won by Curry and Ankerholth.

About 500 persons attended the meet, which is the first of its kind ever held in this city. The summary:
