

Grand Rapids Central Wins Interscholastic Meet at M. A. C. Saturday

Detroit Eastern and Coldwater Tie for Second Place—Lansing Wins Relay in Fast Time, Placing Eighth in Final Reckonings—Two State Records Are Beaten.

Alma, Alpena, Adrian, Bay City, Detroit, Westera, Flint, Ithaca, Kalamazoo, Mason, Rockford, Three Rivers, Williamston, and Ypsilanti schools also entered but failed to score.

In one of the closest and most exciting meets ever staged at East Lansing, Grand Rapids Central won the annual interscholastic meet Saturday, with Detroit Eastern and Coldwater tied for second place just one and one-third points behind the leaders. Not until the final event of the day, the relay, was finished, was the final winner known. Any one of the three leaders by breasting home ahead of the field in this classic would come out of the meet the winners. The hope was upset, however, St. Louis winning in class B, and Lansing in class A. Harvey, running the first lap, gave his companions a big lead which they proceeded to hold, the time of the four being 1:28. This is fast time.

Beats Two Records.

Two interscholastic records were broken in the meet and one tied. The most notable performance of the day by far, was the work of Sheldon, of West Branch, in the mile. He clipped 19 1-5 seconds off the old record, making the distance in 4:33 2-5. He did this without being pushed to the limit and the performance marks him as one of the most promising milers turned out in this state in some time. Van Aken, of Coldwater, broke the other record when he ran the quarter in 52 1-5, which better the old mark by 1 2-5 seconds.

It required nine heats to finish the hundred-yard dash, the field of entrants being so large. Gamble, of Coldwater, finally won, but was forced to the limit by Peppard, of East Lansing. The time was 10 1-5, which equals the existing record. This same Peppard, of East Lansing, ran a pretty race in the 220, winning both his trial heat and the semi-final. He was unlucky in drawing the outside track in the final heat, which compelled him to travel in poorer going.

Can't Touch Kohler's Marks.

Reich, of Detroit Eastern, won the pole vault when he cleared the bar at 10 feet 4 inches. In trying for a record he succeeded in going over at 11 feet even, but could not make the grade at 11 feet 3 inches, the mark that was necessary to establish a new record. The work in the weight, although fair, did not begin to compare with the marks set by Art Kohler in 1909. Blacklock, of Grand Rapids, won the hammer with a heave of 125 feet 3 1-2 inches, which is about 40 feet under the old record. Blacklock, of Grand Rapids, won the beautiful watch donated by L. B. Whitney as a prize to the highest individual point winner when he capped first in the hammer and shot, third in the high hurdles and tied for fourth with two others in the high jump, totaling 12 1-3 points.
