

JUNIORS TAKE INDOOR MEET AT EASTERN

Score 23 Points More Than Freshmen in Interclass Track Events—Seniors Third.

The Juniors won the annual indoor interclass track meet held in the Eastern high gym Thursday afternoon, gobbling up 81-1-2 points while the Freshmen were second with 58 1-2. The Seniors, with a crippled team, managed to nose out the Sophs by one point, gathering 37 counters.

It was shown that the Indians will be represented by a well-balanced team next week in the first dual meet of the year with the LaSalle Y. M. C. A. tracksters. Class was shown in every event excepting the distance runs. Blum, Thompson and Kallhoff, the men who will undoubtedly run these events for Eastern, failing to put in an appearance. Thompson is ill at his home. Blum was busy practicing with the basketball team in the K. G. gym while Kallhoff didn't get onto the floor until the races had been decided.

Much better results could have been made in most of the events, if closely. Elmer Kallhoff, who took the 100 yard dash, has already cleared 5 feet 8 inches, has already cleared 11 feet when cleared. The hurdle races were also won for the men finishing first, although several heats were required because of the big number of entries.

Pinzel Best in Shot Put.
Pinzel, who took the shotput with a heave of 39 feet 3 inches, pulled out much attention, looking like a sure point winner in the interscholastic this summer, getting the pit away in good shape and showing that he has rid himself of his difficulty in putting it high enough. Several heavy first year men weighing well over 200 pounds, also look like good material for the weightlifting form only. They are Stumpf and Houbt. Both have strength, but not the knack of the lift, putting the shot very backwardly.

Eastern needs a quarter-mile more than anything else right now. Captain Williams, Henry, the Kretschmar brothers and Lambert are good in the dashes. The field events are well taken care of, as are the longer runs when the men are only but a fast man who can last the 400 yards is yet to be found. Sixty-six and one-third seconds is the best time made in the quarter, Lambert taking the varsity event. The novice was run two seconds slower.

Williams was the individual star of the meet, winning all three events he was in, both hurdles and 200 yard dash (novice)—senior (Soph), 1:15.5 seconds; second Martin (Fresh), time, 1:15.5 seconds; and Kretschmar (Sen), second; Lambert (Juni), third; Leaver (Juni), fourth, time, 2:45 seconds.
