

Battle Creek Wins Over Lansing High Indoor Track Team

Harvey and Healy of L. H. S. Are Stars of Meet--Local Quartet Captures Relay Event.

Though defeated by the Food City boys at Battle Creek in their indoor track meet last Saturdaynight, Lansing high school is rejoicing over the showing of Harvey and Healey who were the individual stars of the evening. Battle Creek captured 62 1-2 points, Lansing 42 1-2.

Harvey amassed 16 points for his team by capturing two firsts and two seconds. Healey scored 12 1-2 points. He was first in the running broad jump and scored three seconds and tied in another event. Prine and Murphy for Lansing also showed up strong in their events.

The showing of the local boys Saturday should make them strong contestants for the first honors in the invitation meet held under the auspices of the Lansing high school for the reason that the same men, it is

believed, will win their events out-of-doors while Battle Creek will be compelled to divide their points with other schools entered.
