BY PREP.

Lewis institute captured the fifth Northwestern indoor interscholastic meet last night in the Fatten gymnasium with 24½ points. Lane Technical drew second with 13½, University High came third with 13, and Hutchinson, Kas., represented by a single entry, took fourth with 10 points. The rest of the field of winners was well scattered.

From the number of entries and the keenness of competition it was the best indoor meet ever staged by the Purple institution. Four records were broken and one world's record (the one of the sixty yard dash) tied.

Table of points:

Ram Butler, the dusky phenom from Hutchinson, Kas., started the night's entertainment by sprinting down the sixty yard pathway in 39.2-3, a world's record, and one seldom equaled by prep athletes.

New Record for Mile.

A few minutes later, May of Lane smashed the mile run mark by 5.53 seconds, after a hot finish with Byers of Thornton Township. Walker of Evanston academy clipped a fifth of a second off the quarter mile mark, taking the tape in 59.2-3. Bush of New Trier, and Stebert of Lewis institute established a new record in the high jump, clearing the bar at 5 feet 9½ inches, against the old record of 5 feet 8½ inches, held by Loomis of University High.

The recalcitrant Butler smashed a record in the broad jump, the last event of the meet, by a leap of 20 feet 9½ inches. The old mark was 19 feet 10 inches. Butler had the further honor of carrying off individual honors with ten points.

May of Lane and Byers of Thornton Township staged a pretty race in the one mile. Byers led all the way until within a yard of the tape, where the Lane boy slipped by him and broke the tape in the time of 4:53 4-5, breaking the record held by Tower of Evanston academy by 38.3-3.
