Hodge, a new man on the Ann Arbor squad, took first in the broad jump and shotput and tied Carpenter for first honors in the high jump. He has a big frame and is an awkward boy but will be a world beater when the rough edges are worn off.

During this week, Easter vacation, the mats and running track will be painted at Eastern high.

Cass Tech high will send at least one man to the University of Michigan interscholastic meet next month. Crawford is the lad and he will be entered in the high jump. This is the first year that Crawford, a lanky, raw-boned youngster, has competed in high school track work and his ability has surprised all who have seen him in action.
