ANN ARBOR, Mich., May 23.—Chicago University high, runs true to advance dope, gathered in the premier honors at the Ann Arbor interscholastic Saturday afternoon and incidentally hung up four new records.

Lewis Institute surprised the champs by landing in second place, ahead of Keewatin. Grand Rapids Central, Bay City Eastern and Detroit Eastern finished in fourth, fifth and sixth places respectively, while D. U. S. failed to place a man.

Never in recent years has such a wonderful meeting for the University high combination been seen in Michigan interscholastic meets. Carter, Spivrick, Spink and Hole produced a well high unobscured combination, and even if Robinson, the Keewatin star, had been allowed to compete, it is doubtful if he could have lifted his team into first place.

Carter Breaks First Mark.
 To begin with, Carter broke the Michigan interscholastic record by running the hundred in 5.4's, (over the world's interscholastic record, which Robinson made when he ran 5.4's in 1913. As there was a slight favoring wind at his back, he is hardly probable that his record will receive official sanction. An hour later, the same man won the 200 yard dash in 21 2-3, breaking the former interscholastic record of 22 seconds slower than Robinson's performance in the preliminary trial.

Spivrick, of U. High, broke the record for the 440, negotiating the course in 51 1-2, which is 3-2 less than the old mark set last year by Evanson academy. The most wonderful performance of all, perhaps, was the race which Spivrick, of U. H., ran in the half mile against a brisk breeze for 1:00. For the distance, he easily outdistanced his competitors and hung on for a record of 1:00. This is a new record of Meredith's, a new Perry Field record. The University City boys now hold six of the Ann Arbor interscholastic records.

Robinson's Five Exhibition.
 Robinson's performance of running the 220 in 21 flat, Friday, will be brought to the attention of the N. A. C. for official sanction in the bottom 220 Saturday afternoon and to equal his time of the day on Monday. He was disqualifying because of being over size.

Spivrick, of the most, grabbed the 121-2 points. The Keewatin boys were placed in seven places.

events, three of which were firsts, one a third, two fourths and a tie for fourth. This entitles him to the Griffin cup for the highest individual point winner. Carter, of U. H., was second in this respect with ten points to his credit.

The work of Henry, of Detroit Eastern, in the hundred cannot be too strongly commended. The little Boulevard sprinter was up against a world-beater in Carter and at that he pressed him closely at the tape. This performance marks him as the best sprinter ever turned out at the east side school. Hech split his pole on his third trial at the 11 foot 3 inch mark and fell heavily. Williams ran a pretty race in the low hurdles, tying for second place. "Fish" Thompson led for three laps in the mile and would have had third by a yard had he not carelessly allowed Thayer, of Ypsil., to pass him in the last ten feet.

University high now has two legs on the Sid Millard cup, which will become the property of the team winning the meet three times. Shrivick, of University high, grabbed off the Blake cup for breaking the 140 record. The medals and cups were presented to the successful athletes Saturday night at a banquet at the Michigan Union.
