Goelitz Accumulates 19 1-2 of That
School's Total of 23
Points.

With a total of 25 1-2 points, University high of Chicago repeated its performance of last year and walked away with the Michigan Interscholastic meet Saturday. The final summary of points was:

The disqualification of Robinson practically put Keewatin out of the running. If this speed boy had been allowed to compete it is possible that Keewatin's total would have been boosted to 33 and high's total lowered to 21 1/2, giving the Wisconsin school first place. Then again, his participation might not have changed the final result, for Carter of Chicago might have been able to beat the Badger star in both of the events. At least, both races would have been worth seeing.

Ann Arbor's two points were collected in the half mile run, the most sensational of the day. Shadford took third in this event and ran a pretty race. He passed two men on the stretch and gave one of the prettiest exhibition of nerve seen during the meet. When it is taken into consideration that Spink of U. high ran the half in 1:56, breaking both the interscholastic and the Ferry Field records, Shadford's race looks all the better.

The meet was crammed full of broken records. Carter's mark of 21.2 lowers the interscholastic record for the 220 and his mark of 9:4 for the 100 ties the interscholastic record for that event. Shiverick of U. high lowered the quarter-mile record by doing the distance in 51 1/2.

Goelitz, Keewatin's great all-around star, was the big point winner of the day. He took the discuss throw, the low hurdles, the high hurdles, took third in the broad jump, fourth in the hammer throw and shot put, and tied for fourth in the high jump. He looked like a French army officer when he collected all his medals at the banquet Saturday night. He brought home 19 1/2 of the 23 points taken by Keewatin. Summaries:
