

DETROIT'S LIST IS SWELLED BY THREE ENTRIES

**Smith, Meyers and Mason, of
Central, Will Go to Lansing,
Making 26 in All.**

Smith, Myers and Mason, of Central High, were yesterday added to the list of track athletes who will represent Detroit at the M. A. C. interscholastic at East Lansing Saturday, making the local representation at the state meet 26. Eleven of these are from Central, eight from Eastern, four from Cass Tech, and three from Western.

Smith is entered in the pole vault, Myers in the high jump and Mason in the half-mile.

All of the Detroit entrants will leave this afternoon between 1 and 4 o'clock, Eastern High's team being the last to leave.

Excepting one chance in the pole vault and two in the high jump, Detroit high schools stand little show in the field events.

Reich, of Eastern, is the only pole-vaulter of any ability, who will represent a local school, while Carpenter, of Central, and Crawford, of Cass Tech, are the only local high-jumpers who have cleared 5 feet, 5 inches this season.

Although four Detroit schools will send teams to the meet, Finzel, of Eastern, will be the only Detroitier to compete in the weight events. As Bay City Eastern, Grand Rapids Central, Muskegon and Lansing have entrants who have shown decided class with the shot, discus and hammer, it is doubtful if a local school will squeeze in on even one point in any of these three events.

Pat Smith, of Bay City, won the shot-put at Ann Arbor, with a heave of 45 feet, 9 inches, with Grotegat, of Grand Rapids, and Kimball, of Muskegon, pressing him closely. Grotegat and Smith also placed in the discus while Kimball ran away with the hammer throw with a toss of 140 feet, 4-1-2 inches. Miller, of Lansing, coming second and Smith third.

Six Detroit boys are entered in the broad jump but, judging by the work done at the Ann Arbor meet, Luther, of Grand Rapids, and Burgess, of Richmond, who finished first and second respectively, will again take first honors.

Although all of the local boys entered have cleared over 19 feet, it is doubtful if they have a chance for better than third place. Williams, Reich and Kretschmar, of Eastern, Elliottson, of Central, and Koehn, of Western, will broad jump for local schools.
