### Gives Misner Track "M"

Misner pulled down third place in the low sticks, giving him his first track "M" from Muskegon, although he has been in track competition for several years. Cone in the pole vault brought the remaining 1-3 point to Muskegon by tying for fourth place with two other vaulters.

The meet Saturday was annexed by Detroit Eastern with 25 points and Bay City Eastern was but two points behind while Muskegon trailed after the Bay City aggregation by two points.

### Henry Smashes Record.

The winner of the 100 yard dash smashed the only mark lowered during this meet. Henry breasting the tape in 10 flat in the 100, being hard pressed by Kretschmar, his team mate.

Pat Smith, the sensational weight man from Bay City Eastern was presented with a handsome watch by L. B. Whitney for being high individual point winner. Smith won the shot-put and discus and placed in the hammer.

### Meet a Big Success.

The meet was the most successful ever staged under the auspices of the M. A. C., during the eight years the Aggies have been bringing the state high schoolers here. Eighteen of the 37 schools that had men entered broke into the scoring, Oscoda, Britton, East Blissfield, and several other hitherto unheard of towns being put on the map by showing better athletic material than big schools like Detroit Central and Ann Arbor.

Donovan, of Alpena, broke his right arm just above the wrist while high jumping. He fell clearing the bar at 5 feet 3 inches, landing on his arm. Alpena lost its best man by this accident and was kept out of the relay, as Donovan was also a member of the half-mile team.
