

BIG ATTENDANCE AT PLAYGROUND ATHLETIC MEET

FIRST IN SERIES OF SUMMER SPORT PROGRAMS PROVES TO BE A POPULAR ATTRACTION.

MAKE GOOD SHOWING

Student-Athletes Show Themselves to Be in Good Vacation Condition—Winners Are Members of Grammar School Athletic League.

More than three hundred friends of the young athletes were interested spectators of the city playgrounds athletic meet at Moore's park, Saturday afternoon. The occasion was the first of a series of city meets to be held under auspices of the Lansing Playgrounds association and in connection with the summer work of that association.

Baird Harvey Winner.

Baird Harvey was winner of the individual points in the meet with 1.34 points. Other totals made by contestants were as follows: Murray Gardner, 17 points; Arthur Prince, 19½ points; Charles Stabbler, 7; L. Sessions, 4½; C. Blanchard, 5; Earl Miller, 4; L. Brucker, 3; G. Brown, 3; E. Nixon, 1 point.

Winners of the first three places in the various contests follow: Shot put, Sessions, 25.9½ feet; Miller, 34.5 feet; Stabbler, 32 feet.

100-yard dash—Harvey first in 19.1; with Gardner second and Prince third.

Football throw—Stabbler first with distance of 121 feet four inches; Brucker second with 128 feet one inch; Miller third with 116 feet four inches.

880-yard dash—Boyce first, time 2:29; Harvey second; Session and Prince tie for third.

Pole vault—Harvey first with height of 10 feet two inches; Gardner second with nine feet 11 inches; Stabbler nine feet seven inches.

220-yard dash—Won by Harvey in 25.1 seconds; with Gardner second and Boyce third.

High jump—Won by Prince with distance of five feet one inch; Harvey making five feet and Sessions four feet ten.

Half mile bicycle race—Won by Blanchard, with Brown second and Nixon third.

Pull up won by Gardner with 22 points; Harvey second with 18 points and Prince third with 11 points.

Running broad jump—Harvey first with distance of 19.2; Prince second with 18.7; and Boyce third with 18.1.

440 yard dash—Harvey winner, time .53; Gardner second and Boyce third.
