Radford's Tumble in Relay Allows '16 Lads to Cop Annual Indoor Tourney

When Carl Radford, freshman, fell on the final lap of the relay in the annual high school interclass indoor meet at the Y. M. C. A., Saturday night, the tide of victory turned to the seniors and allowed the '16 lads to defeat the first year men by a score of 39½ to 58½.

Radford's great speed threw him when he struck the turn. However, the freshman lad was not denied a big portion of the meet's glory for he emerged the largest point winner, counting 12 for his class. Williams, a senior, was second in this department with 10 points.

Whitney clipped a half second off the track half-mile record going the distance in 2 min., 11 1-5 sec.
