

## NORTHWESTERN BEATS CENTRAL IN DUAL MEET

Well-Contested Affair Goes to  
Colts by 48 to 38; Isbell  
Stars in Distance Runs.

Northwestern high's track team won its dual indoor meet with the Central high aggregation on the former's floor Saturday afternoon by 48 to 38.

Central secured but two first places outside of the relay. Benson scored both, winning the 25-yard dash and the 220. There were two events in which Central tied for first, however, Turnbull splitting points in the pole vault while Hagerman broke even with Mason in the high jump.

Isbell, the sensational distance man from Northwestern, captured first in both half and mile runs with comparative ease. His time was good in each, being 4:45 5-5 in the mile and 2:14 1-2 in the 880, although he could have improved on it had more speed been required.

Good results were obtained in practically every one of the 10 events, the quarter being run in 46 seconds. Excepting the half and the relay, each school scored points in all events. Northwestern took all nine points in the 880 but lost the relay. The latter event, incidentally, was a closely-contested affair from the run, the majority of spectators having figured that Burns, the Central man, had beaten Benson, of Central, across the tape. It was a hairline finish.
