10 and 2-5 seconds. He ran his preliminary heat in 10 and 3-5 seconds while the time for his semi-finals was the same as his finals. Bierman of Benton Harbor was also entered in this event but showed little for the orange and black rooters to become enthused over. His time of 11 flat in his preliminary heat was the slowest of the afternoon. He failed to qualify for the finals losing out in the semi-finals.

Scholz's first place came in the shot put, the big Dutchman heaving the 12-pound weight through the air for a distance of 41 ft. 7 1/2 in. In the high jump he finished second to Walker, the Dowagiac star, who set a record with a leap of 5 ft. 10 in. Scholz's highest jump was 5 ft. 7 in. In the running broad jump the maize and blue star should have been returned winner but Dame Fortune chose to smile on Nunne of Paw Paw instead. All afternoon Scholz had been doing over 20 ft. registering 20 ft. 5 in. on two different occasions and 20 ft. 2 1/2 in. on another, while Nunne had been doing nothing over 19 ft. all afternoon, in fact he had never done 20 ft. nor will probably never do it again. However, before his last trial he must have spied a four-leaf clover for he shot through the ozone for a mark of 20 ft. 7 in.

Meet is Satisfying.

All events were staged on scheduled time, and the meet with over 200 entries and 11 events was run off in the record time of 3 hours and 45 minutes. Coaches who have been entering teams in interscholastic meets for several years admitted that in entries, close finishes and records made, that this was Michigan's greatest meet of this kind in some time. After the banquet the visiting athletes were guests of the Normal at the first number on the May festival program.
