

MUSKEGON TIES FOR THIRD PLACE

Grand Rapids Central Wins
Track Meet at East
Lansing.

ST. JOSEPH TEAM SECOND

Cross, Wingerden, Wilson and
Sheridan Win 13 Points
For M. H. S.

East Lansing, June 12—Grand Rapids Central ran away with the interscholastic track championship of Michigan Saturday afternoon with a total score of 44 1-2 points, 30 1-2 points better than its nearest competitor, St. Joseph, which placed second with a score of 14, and in turning the trick Upton's boys equaled a couple of state records and acquired permanent possession of the Harvard cup for the highest number of points tallied by any one team during a period of five years in interscholastic track competitions. McKenzie, Central's star dash man, also pulled down the day's high individual honors with a total of 11 1-4 points.

Muskegon tied for third place with Lansing, with 12 points. Cross of that city took the pole vault in good form with a height of 10 feet 9 inches, while Wingerden and Wilson both Muskies, with Gardner of Lansing tied for second, third and fourth honors in this event.

Sheridan won second place for the Sawdust City in the hammer throw.
