

THREE DETROIT TEAMS IN BIG PREP CLASSIC

Detroit University School Has Best Prospects in Michigan Interscholastic Track and Field Meet Friday and Saturday—Two High Schools to Be Represented—269 Athletes Entered.

REPRESENTATIVES of three Detroit prep schools will attend the University of Michigan interscholastic track and field meet at Ann Arbor, Friday and Saturday.

The Detroit University school leads in number of entrants, having nine in the class A events and four in class B. Eastern high will also have nine in class A, while Northwestern high will have one.

Leith's D. U. S. aggregation has better prospects than any of the local teams, most of which will be satisfied with acquiring several places. Coach of the Eastern high team is giving his men some experience for the big high school meet at East Lansing later in the month, while Coach Maris, of Northwestern, figures that his entrant, Isbell, has a very good chance to capture high honors in the mile run.

Strong Competition Expected.

Better competition than any of the Detroiters have ever been forced to argue with will be found at Ann Arbor, as athletes from 19 of the best preparatory and high schools in the west will make a bid for points. Detroit's high schools don't pretend to be able to compete with such teams as Kew-Forest academy, Chicago university high, Lewis institute and many private schools, which will be represented. The fact that there are 269 athletes entered furnishes an idea of how great the opposition will be.

D. U. S. should place in the dash, hurdles and weight events. Swift, Power, Robb and Webster have been working hard for the sprints and hurdles. Bond has been tossing the shot around 15 feet regularly, and his ability with the discus and hammer has been surprisingly good. This is an unusually good performance for a prep lad, and should furnish points. Osher is

another heavyweight who looks good in the shot. Weber and Swift are also in the high and broad jumps and pole vault. Power and Robb are in the 410, while McKee, Christian and Taylor are in the 880. Leith has entered Webster, Swift, Robb, Power and Christian in the half-mile relay. Following are his entries in the class B events: 100-yard dash—Dewey and Smith; 220-yard dash—McKee, Taylor, Smith; 440-yard dash—McKee, Taylor, Smith and Dewey; half-mile run—Taylor, Dewey and McKee; mile run—Taylor; one-mile relay—Dewey, McKee, Taylor and Smith.

Could Win Championship.

Leith could easily capture the class B championship, as D. U. S. qualifies in this class, but he has confidence in the ability of his lad to make a good showing in the class A competition.

Eastern high has Truockner and McPherson in the 100, 220 and 440; Gleason in the 100, high hurdles, pole vault, high jump and 220; Spierley in the high jump and high hurdles; McCracken in the pole vault and broad jump; Wojciechowski in the 440 and relay; Walbridge in the 880; Wurm in the shot, hammer and discus and St. Leon in the sprints.

All are pretty fair performers. Wojciechowski hasn't been in the best of condition this season, however, due to illness during the spring, otherwise he would look good for points. In the quarter he may surprise Coach Wuesthoff, however, and come through with allhoff left for Ann Arbor with all excepting St. Leon. Truockner is expected to take an examination Friday morning, but will reach Ann Arbor in time for the trials in the afternoon. Snyder, Eastern's entry in the mile, was left behind, due to ineligibility. He has been running this distance in good time this season, and his failure to qualify in his studies cheats Eastern out of some expected points.

Colored Flyers to Buenos Aires.
