

BRINGS HOME 2 CUPS FROM U. OF M. MEET

MERCHANT WINS IN THE 100-YARD AND 220-YARD AT ANN ARBOR.

TROPHIES FILL WINDOW

Speed Star's Success Puts St. Joseph in Third Place at University Meet. —Made 100 in 10 3-8, —220 in 27 4-8.

Leonard C. Merchant, captain of the St. Joseph high track team, won two laurels for himself and his school when he won the cups in the 100 and 220-yard dashes for Class B schools at the University of Michigan Intercollegiate field and track meet held last Saturday at Ferry Field, Ann Arbor.

Merchant was never pushed in either event and was allowed to call his home in the century in 10 3-8 seconds and in the 220-yard dash in 27 4-8 seconds. His time in the 100 of Saturday was exactly the same as that he made in the previous meet the day previous. Wilbur of Cassiopolis finished second in both dashes. Merchant's two firsts added him ten points for the afternoon and placed St. Joseph in third place for Class B schools.

Adds More Cups.

Two more silver loving cups were added to his collection of trophies, which with the one he captured last year as a result of his victory in the 120-yard dash, makes three that the maine and blue star has brought home from the university meet. Merchant still retains the honor of being the only athlete from the local institution of learning to ever land a first place trophy at the state athletic meet.

A display of the trophies and medals that have been captured by the various teams of the high school this year has been made in the window of the Commercial National bank. It includes the Warren cup, donated by E. R. Warren of Three Oaks for the basketball championship; the Commercial National bank loving cup for track; the shield which the Merchant School combination knocked down at the Western State Normal meet; three banners donated by the Berrien County Intercollegiate association for winners of the 1914 basketball, track and relay championships; and the individual medals and loving cups handed by the different ones for work done on the track at the local meet and different state meets. It is to display that any school may feel proud of and to be admired by parents as much as by local citizens.

To Go to State Meet.

This week will mark the close of track training. Only one more meet remains in which the local school will participate and that is the state meet held under the auspices of the Michigan Agricultural college at Lansing. Capt. Merchant, Les and Charles (Doc) Scholtz, Hatch and Germond are the men who will faint the maine and blue colors next Saturday at the state capital city. Merchant will enter the dashes, Scholtz the running high and broad jumps and the shot put, Germond the mile, Hatch the pole vault and high jump, Les the pole vault and 120-yard dash, while C. Rose will take care of one lap in the relay. This meet will mark the last time that Merchant, Scholtz and C. Rose will wear the local colors, the high school losing these three stars via the graduation route. A banquet will be given Thursday night at the Calhoun theater through the generosity of Manasse Harmon. It will help defray the expenses of the team.
