

BELTZ IS LOCALS' BEST BET IN MEET

**Shassberger's Discus Hurler
Should Land at Least One
First at M. A. C.**

With the annual Michigan interscholastic track and field meet slated for Friday and Saturday of this week, Coach Shassberger is rounding his lads into shape. Shassberger does not claim Lansing will be the winner of the meet, but he does predict that Lansing will not fall far behind in points and medals in a few field events.

Lester Beltz looks like a sure winner in the discus throw. He has won first place in two meets at Kalamazoo this season and is making a better distance every day. At the meet of Kalamazoo Normal college Beltz threw the discus 107 feet 10 1/2 inches. His work in the hammer throw is not discouraging as he copped second honors in that event at Kalamazoo Saturday.

J. D. Hamilton is coming good in the high jump and pole vault. At the meet Saturday he placed second in both events, coming only a few inches from the winner. Shassberger believes that Hamilton will be able to make a better mark at the meet at M. A. C. Friday, as he is accustomed to the grounds, having practiced there with the high school team two nights each week for the past month.

The shotput is sure to bring Lansing some returns in the way of points, as Dunphy, who resides at East Lansing, has been practicing at the college field for some time and his heave at the Kalamazoo Normal meet was 40 feet 5 1/2 inches.

In the track events the coach does not seem to have much faith. The team has had no track to practice on during the whole training season, as the track has been destroyed by builders on the new addition to the high school.
