

Upton Lands More Honors for Central

East Lansing, May 28.—Grand Rapids Central High avenged its defeat on the gridiron last fall at the hands of Detroit Central by nosing the Detroit boys out of the interscholastic track championship of Michigan at the M. A. C. meet. The final score stood: Grand Rapids Central, 33; Detroit Central, 25½; Kalamazoo, 20; Otsego, 16.

Unexpected form shown by Harold Jones in the half mile really won the meet for Central. In one of the hardest races of the day he crossed the line ahead of the field. Jake Vandevisse again proved his supremacy in the mile by passing a half dozen other runners in the last quarter, finishing twenty feet in front. Capt. Guy Houston again won the quarter mile and gave Brown of Detroit Central a great race in the 220, finishing second.

The relay race also was won by Central. Steketee, Beard, Hopkins and Houston formed the team, Houston gaining the winning margin on the last lap when pitted against Brown of Detroit Central. The relay race was the last event of the day and decided the meet in favor of the local school.

Reserve strength of the Upton team played a great part in winning. Besides the four firsts Beard took third in the 220-yard low hurdles, Hopkins third in the 100-yard dash, Jones third in the 440-yard dash; Vandevisse third in the half mile; Steketee third in the hammer throw and Houston second in the 220-yard dash.

The Ablon cup, the Larrabee cup and the James Rayle cup were won outright by Central and another leg was gained on the Harvard cup. It was Central's third track championship in four years.

Harold Jones, who distinguished himself in the half mile, was elected captain of the 1918 team on the return trip to Grand Rapids. It was a three-cornered tie between Jones, Beard and Steketee and a toss of the coin decided it. Beard will captain the relay team.

For Grand Rapids South Brusso won two points by taking third in the mile. Union did not place.

Kurtz of Kalamazoo was the individual point winner of the meet with thirteen. Brown and Brokaw of Detroit Central were second and third in this respect.
