

LANSING RUNNERS SECOND AT KAZOO

Though Lads Fail to Land a
First They Are Inside
Money.

KALAMAZOO, May 7.—Grand Rapids Central high school won the third annual Kalamazoo college interscholastic track and field meet here Saturday with 41 points to its credit.

Kalamazoo Central finished second with 34 1-2 points and Lansing was third with 16.

Lloyd Kurtz and Preston Mathews took 15 and 13 points respectively for Kalamazoo Central, allowing the locals to threaten the Furniture City team at all stages of the meet.

Grand Rapids was strong in the long distance runs. Vanderviss being unbeatable while his teammates managed to add a first and several seconds and thirds.

Rowe of Chelsea, furnished one of the features by winning the pole vault at a height of 10 feet, 8 inches. The best previous mark for this was 9 feet, 10 inches made by Workman of Plainwell, in 1915. Other records broken were in the shotput, discus, and high hurdles.

Lansing's point winners were: Kipke third in the 440, Dunphy third in the shotput, Hamilton tied for second in the high jump. Betts second and Bishop third in the discus throw, Hamilton tied for second in the pole vault, relay team third.
