

CENTRAL IS FAVORITE IN TRACK EVENT

Showing of Blue and White Athletes in Previous Meets Leads to Belief They'll Win.

COLTS AND INDIANS BATTLE FOR SECOND

All But One of City's Schools to Have Representation in "Y" Competition Saturday.

Central high school, with victories over Northwestern, Eastern and Northern in dual indoor track meets, is picked to win the first annual indoor intercollegiate track carnival at the Y. M. C. A. Saturday with Northwestern, regardless of its defeat by Eastern in a close favorite.

Either the Colts or Indians may win the state championship, but as the dual meet stands, both only are dark horses. The victory is almost certain to go to the Jack Avenue team because of the recent showing by the Red and Gray made against Central. Those who witnessed the Eastern-Northwestern battle a few weeks back are inclined to think the Colts the better of the two, although the Indians' record is credited with a victory.

Northern high school, making its debut in indoor track circles, has a good chance for fourth place unless, by chance, the Colts win. Thursday afternoon includes the stars of Northwestern, Central and Eastern and in that event the latter show a fair chance of finishing higher up.

Was From Western.

Western high school, for the event, is expected to be the favorite. The "Cowboy" team, which has had an intercollegiate record for the past few years, is the favorite. It has won in all of its athletic events, and has been putting in long hours of practice since the school opened in the autumn. The four schools which have been participating in the "Y" meet are the Colts, Indians, Eastern and Northwestern. The Colts are the favorite, but the Indians are also a strong contender. The Eastern and Northwestern teams are also expected to do well.

The "Y" meet is being held at the Y. M. C. A. building, and will be held on Saturday afternoon. The event is expected to be a very successful one, and will attract a large crowd of spectators.

Two Have 22 Members.

Northern and Central are tied for first at 22 members of the "Y" meet. Both having entered 22 members in dual meets. Eastern, with 21, is one of the schools which has not been listed from here.

Thompson Is Picked.

Tompson, of Northwestern, is capable of doing 9 ft. 8 in. in the pole vault, and if he fills his capabilities, should win that event for the Red and Gray. Galingher, of Northern, Streit, of Eastern, Wehster, of Northern, and Hutchings, of Central, are above the 9 foot mark also.

Eastern looks to have the eight points in the shot put through Kuznow and Rockwell, both having put the lead ball a distance of 46 feet this spring. There is a possible chance of them falling off a bit and in that event Mark, of Northwestern, who throws the weight regularly at 32 feet, will have a chance to get in on the honor. Perkins and Henderson, both of Northwestern, will also push the lead missile for the Colts.

Central will probably take first and second in the 27-yard low hurdles, as Bronkert and McCallum have been beating all other prep runners in that competition. Brenkert can do the dash in 4 flat, Smith, of Eastern, and Sprung, of Northwestern, also are conceded a chance.

Rockwell Is Dash Star.

Captain Rockwell, of the Indians, should win the 27-yard dash for the Mack Avenue aggregation, as this lad has been timed at 2.4-2 for the distance. Bronkert, of Central, will most likely place second to the Boulevard streak. Chapin, of Northwestern, and Brown and Drowski, of Central, will also stand a show in the small dash.

Leitch, of Northwestern, who slipped off the 886 in 2:16 flat against Central Saturday last, should win the half-mile event with a repetition of that time. Cooper, of Central; Rice, of Northern; Souter, Eastern, and Everett, of Central, also have done this distance in good time.

Sprung, leader of the Colts, should win the 300-yard dash, judging from previous performances. Phunphry brothers, of Central, are conceded a chance at the gold emblem in this event also.

Rockwell, of Eastern, Chapin, of Northwestern, and Whittman, of Eastern, should stage a merry race for 220 honors. The last named has the best time of the trio to his credit, having clipped it off at 2:5.
