

A. A. U. MEET IS EXPECTED TO DRAW PREP TRACKSTERS

Carnival at Belle Isle Will Become Annual Affair—Fifteen Standard Events Are Scheduled and City's Cinder Stars Will Compete.

High school athletes and those unattached should form a large percentage of the contestants in the first annual A. A. U. city championship track meet to be held under the auspices of the recreation commission at Belle Isle on the morning of the Fourth in conjunction with the Americanization pageant, which the commission is planning.

While the D. A. C., Y. M. C. A., and Y. M. O are largely responsible for the promotion of the meet and field day by the municipal department of recreation and should for the most part constitute the entry list, the various events are thrown open to all athletes of the vicinity and every effort is being put forth to create interest among outside track men.

No entrance fee will be required, and no restriction whatever will be

imposed on contestants other than registration with the A. A. U. Athletes not already registered with this amateur organization can secure same by the payment of 25 cents, which is the ordinary registration fee.

Entry blanks can be secured at any of the clubs mentioned above, at the various sporting goods houses and at the recreation commission, 820 Farwell building, to which place all entries should be mailed or sent. Entries close next Saturday, June 29, and all mailed entries must bear a postmark of not later than this date.

Fifteen standard A. A. U. events are on the program, including 100-yard dash, 220, 440, half mile, one mile, two miles, running broad jump, running high jump, shot put, pole vault, 100 high hurdles, 220 low, and the one mile relay. A hand grenade throw will also be included if enough interest in such an event is manifested. A one-mile relay race for teams of men in the service of the army and navy will complete the program.
