## Whittemore, U. of M., Wins Y. M. C. A. Run

Eddie Whittemore of the University of Michigan won the Y. M. C. A.'s annual road race Thanksgiving morning over the Grand Boulevard, running the distance of four miles in 23 minutes and five seconds. A. C. Cotter, unattached, was second with Matti Hauninen of the Finnish A. C. third.

Ann Arbor High, with 59 points, captured the team cup, while Y. M. C. A. came in a close second with 52 points. The other teams were strong all the way down the line. Three Ann Arbor runners finished in the first 10, while M. A. C. placed two in the select class.

In the walking race, Charles Foster competing under the colors of the Y. M. C. A., breasted the tape far in advance of the rest of the field, making the distance in exceptionally good time of 23:55 1/2. Elmer Hueisnampen of the Y. M. C. A. was second with Harry Hassig, unattached, third.

The team cup in this event was captured by the Y. M. C. A. with a total of 30 points, the local association placing three men in the first 10, while Y. M. O. was next with two entries.

Both races were hotly contested and brought out the keenest competition seen locally in many seasons. The only disappointing feature was the failure of Eddie Gruend, the "V" after long-distance runner to start. He had been expected to be the likely winner of the running event, too, for some time, as before failed to put in an appearance.

A large crowd lined both sides of the boulevard and cheered the contestants from start to finish.
