

OFFER MEDALS TO SCHOOLBOYS

Three Prizes in Each
Event at Track Cham-
pionship Meet Here.

Nine Detroit high schools are entered in the City Interscholastic track championship meet at Northeastern High School April 3 and 5. Western High is the only school not entered.

Richard E. Remington, faculty athletic manager at Northeastern, will step from the beaten path in staging the meet in inviting schools not members of the Detroit High School Athletic Association to enter athletes. University High, Detroit University School and Highland Park High have been given the privilege of entering teams.

PLENTY OF MEDALS.

Another innovation will be the offering of medals for first, second and third places. In the past it has been the custom to offer but one medal for each event.

The events on the program will be the 30-yard dash, 220-yard dash, 440, half-mile, mile, 30-yard low and high hurdles, pole vault, high jump, shot put and relay.

DOPE FOUR TO WIN.

Northwestern, Central, Eastern and Northern, the four largest schools in the city which are expected to capture a majority of the places in the meet, will be asked to divide 60 per cent of the cost of staging the meet between them and the other schools the remainder.
