

PREP CINDER ATHLETES WILL MEET AT ANN ARBOR, MAY 24

Nineteenth Annual Interscholastic Cinder Carnival Is Announced and Should Include Track Teams From All Major High Schools in State—David Forbes, 1916 Grand Rapids Central Leader, Will Manage Affair—Entry Blanks Ready.

Ann Arbor, Mich., April 28.—University of Michigan will hold its nineteenth annual interscholastic track meet on Ferry field, Saturday, May 24, the first occasion of its kind since the spring of 1916.

No expense for these contesting schools is involved other than that of transportation to and from Ann Arbor. The visitors will be lodged and boarded by the various house clubs and fraternities, and all expenses of the meet are borne by the athletic association.

David A. Forbes, who captained the Grand Rapids Central team that landed third in the 1916 meet, has been appointed interscholastic manager by Director Bartelme. All schools contemplating sending athletes to the meet should have their entries in by May 14. Entry blanks will be forwarded with announcements.

Run Under M. I. A. A.

Eligibility at the meet will be under the regular rulings of the M. I. A. A. Questions as to eligibility will be decided by board consisting of three faculty members of schools who are members of the M. I. A. A., P. G. Bartelme and Manager David Forbes. Officials will be chosen from the "M" men of the various varsity teams. Each school will be allowed three entries in every event,

two of whom may contest. First place will count five points, second place three, third place two and fourth place one.

Preliminaries will be held on the morning of the twenty-fourth in the following track and field events: 150-yard dash, shot put, half mile run, pole vault, 120-yard hurdles, 440-yard dash, hammer throw, 220-yard hurdles, running broad jump and 220-yard dash. In the afternoon the semi-finals and finals in the above events will be staged, and in addition, the mile run and a half mile relay. The five best men in each event will qualify for the finals.

Medals for Three Places.

Medals will be awarded for first, second and third places respectively in each event. In addition, cups have been donated by various honorary societies and Ann Arbor business men for winning teams and individual point winners as follows:

Sid Millard cup, for team winning meet three years; Huston cup for team winning relay three years, a cup for individual point winner, one for first place in the 100-yard dash, and the Ray P. Blake cup for breaking the record in the half mile.

In the 1916 meet that was held here, Oregon, Illinois, came in first, Toledo Scott second, and Grand Rapids Central third. It was this year that the two Oregon boys, Landers and Loomis were the stellar performers, Landers winning the cup for individual honors.
