

# 30 Michigan Schools Will Compete In Western Normal 3rd Annual Interscholastic

Kalamazoo will entertain a host of Michigan track and field stars tomorrow, when the teams from 30 high schools gather here to participate in the third annual interscholastic meet held under the auspices of Western Normal college. In addition to the 221 nominators, the various schools will also send hundreds of supporters to the meet, and with good weather conditions prevailing, Normal field will present a gala appearance.

## GREAT PROGRAM.

Coach W. H. Spaulding has been successful beyond his fondest hopes and the meet will be easily one of the greatest interscholastics held in the state of Michigan.

The program is a great one, 16 events in all, and with the big fields assured, it has been arranged to start the field events in the morning, also to run off all preliminaries in the track events in the morning hours.

There will be a class B half-mile relay race for schools from towns under 10,000 population.

On account of the large number of entries in the previous Western Normal interscholastic meets there will be two separate 440-yard races. Medals will be awarded for each race.

Events—100-yard dash, 220-yard dash, 440-yard dash (two races), 880-yard run, 1-mile run, 120-yard hurdles, 220-yard hurdles, running high jump, running broad jump, pole vault, shot-put, hammer throw, discus throw, 880-yard class A relay, 88-yard class B relay.

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to athletes winning first, second, third and fourth places in each event. Trophies, loving cups and winners will go to winning school, relay winners and winners of individual honors.

Western Normal college plans to entertain all visiting athletes and the boys will be given a great day.
