Detroit Eastern high athletes won in the third annual Western Normal interscholastic, Saturday afternoon, with a total of 25½ points. The victors were close pressed by Grand Rapids South, which rolled up 24 points, while Battle Creek, was a good third, with 21 counters. Detroit Central with 18½ points and Detroit Northwestern, with 18, points, also showed strong. The other schools were never dangerous contenders.

Two small schools stepped into the limelight. Gobleville introduced a star runner in George Walker, of the famous Walker family, noted in Kalamazoo college annals. He won the 100-yard dash and established a new Normal record, also captured the 220-yard dash. He was the class of both events and his winnings placed him a tie with McCallum, of Detroit Central for first honors individually.

Paw Paw high's relay team ran a splendid race and captured the class B. event.

FOUR NEW RECORDS.

Four new records were hung for the meet, as shown in the summary at the head of the column.

Kalamazoo Central's team, which won the Kalamazoo college interscholastic by a wide margin, was the disappointment of the meet, scoring but 11 points and finishing away down in the running. Both Ward Platt and O. Miller, usually good for 10 to 15 points each, were away off and failed to land in the summaries.

The preliminaries started in the morning and officials were kept hustling to run the meet off by 4 in the afternoon. The contests were featured by splendid spirit and excellent fields. Western Normal served an athletic luncheon at noon and supper at 5:30

in the evening. At this time the trophies and medals were awarded.
