

LOCAL ATHLETES ENTER ANN ARBOR SCHOLASTIC MEET

Central, Eastern and North-western Will Send Track Teams to University Town.

Central, Eastern and Northwestern, the trio represented at the Kalamazoo interscholastic track meet last Saturday will enter teams in the Ann Arbor affair held under the auspices of the University of Michigan Saturday afternoon.

The Detroit schools made exceptionally well showings at the Celery City town, Eastern winning by a point and a half, Central landing in fourth place, and the Colts coming fifth, a half a counter behind the Blue and White.

McCallum Stars.

Eddie McCallum, the Central hurdler, was the high scorer among the Detroit athletes, and, tied with Walker of Gobbleville, for individual honors with 10 points. Cooper, also of Central, was close behind with eight markers. Eastern, though winning the meet, only copped two events, but the Black and White lads were on the job when it came to picking up stray points and grabbed enough seconds and thirds to put them ahead of the field. For the Colts, Day did the best work, winning the broad jump besides placing in a number of other events.

Just how the local aggregations will fair at Ann Arbor is hard to predict but with such teams as Hyde Park and various other Illinois schools entered the opposition is certain to be much stiffer than it was at Kalamazoo. About the same number of men that made the trip last week will be entered in the U. of M. affair.
